Due to expanded supply, Advocate Aurora Health has expanded COVID-19 testing to patients with no symptoms (asymptomatic testing), in addition to those who are symptomatic. Patients are able to self-schedule the test via Aurora's website, through the LiveWell app or on a walk-in basis. - Application required, but can be waived if they are only using service for the 2 shots
- Fare of \$4.00 can be waived if they disclose to dispatchers they are going to the clinic when reserving the ride
- Need to call to reserve trip at least one day in advance

### Western Kenosha County Transit – 1-888-203-3498

- Available to general public
- No application required
- Service area is Western Kenosha County
- Fare of \$5.00 (general public) \$3.00 (elderly and disabled) can be waived if they disclose to dispatchers that they are going to a clinic when reserving the ride
- Need to call to reserve trip at least one day in advance

- Available to Medicaid recipients only
- Service area is not limited

Update on FoodShare Renewals and Six-Month Reports as of July 28, 2021

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## **Renewals due in March, April, May, and June 2021 postponed for 12 months**

We have postponed renewals that were originally due in March, April, May, and June 2021 for a total of 12 months. If your renewal was due in those months, you will now need to complete the renewal process in March, April, May, and June 2022 instead. You will get a letter in the mail about 45 days before your renewal is due. You will also see a message in your ACCESS account.

## **Some FoodShare renewals started again in April 2021**

Based on federal law, we can only postpone FoodShare renewals for a certain amount of time. As a result, members who had renewals postponed last year need to complete the renewal process this year. If you need to complete the renewal process, you will get a letter in the mail about 45 days before your renewal is due. You will also see a message in your ACCESS account.

## **Renewals cannot be postponed starting July 2021**

Starting in July 2021, any renewals originally due in July 2021 and months after that will need to be completed. We are not able to postpone those renewals under current federal law

If you get FoodShare or have gotten Pandemic EBT benefits, you can order and pay for your food on Amazon's and Walmart Grocery's websites using your QUEST or P-EBT card. There will be an EBT card payment option for you to enter your card details. You will need to enter your card PIN each time you check out.

You can only use your QUEST or P-EBT card to [buy food\(link is external\)](#). If you are buying other items at the same time, you need to use another form of payment to pay for those items.

Amazon delivers across the state and offers free shipping on eligible orders over a certain dollar amount. Walmart may deliver depending on where you live, or you may need to pick up your order at the store. In some cases, you may be charged a delivery fee. You will not be able to use your QUEST or P-EBT card to pay this fee. You will need to use another form of payment instead.

If you experience any issues when using your QUEST or P-EBT card to pay online, first make sure you have a balance on your card by going to the [ebtEDGE website\(link is external\)](#), using the [ebtEDGE mobile app\(link is external\)](#), or calling QUEST Card Service at 877-415-5164. If you have a balance and are still unable to complete your transaction, contact customer service at Amazon or Walmart for help.

Currently, [Amazon\(link is external\)](#), [Walmart\(link is external\)](#), [ALDI \(with Instacart\)\(link is external\)](#), and [Woodman's\(link is external\)](#) grocery stores all accept QUEST or P-EBT cards for online orders on their websites. (Their websites refer to these cards as "SNAP EBT" or "EBT" cards.)

## **Other Purchasing Options:**

Some grocery stores offer other options to help people purchase their food safely and easily. For example, people can order their food online or over the phone, choose an EBT card payment option, and swipe their QUEST or P-EBT card when they pick up their order, either curbside or in store. People should check with their local grocery stores to see what options they offer.

## **Medication for Opioid Use Disorders Programs**

#### **American Telepsychiatry**

Basic services we provide are: initial psychiatric/SUDs intake, plan of care based on that, medication administration/management, and psychotherapy. We provide services face-to-face. Face to face can be video face-to-face or in-person face-to-face. During the public health emergency, we can also provide services via audio-only connection to the patient in the home. During this emergency, we have developed a very simple intake form. Essentially the client or their advocate would call Susie, she will take down some demographic and medication-related information (i.e., what meds are you currently taking), and then she would schedule the patient. Susie would facilitate the interaction between the patient and the provider on the date of the appointment. The patient needs to have a computer with a webcam and microphone, and internet access.

## CleanSlate

Through our unique treatment model, CleanSlate brings high-quality medication-assisted treatment, using buprenorphine (Suboxone), naltrexone (Vivitrol), which are all in pill form, as part of an individualized treatment plan led by our trained medical staff. Additionally, our care coordination services help patients find the needed support services such as counseling, childcare, housing and transportation.

In keeping with social distancing during this pandemic, **we are now conducting all our medical and mental health visits via telehealth.** Call the CleanSlate Kenosha Center at **262-842-0149** for more information or to make an appointment. **Also, new patients are welcome!**

## Family Psychiatric Care

At Family Psychiatric Care we have been seeing clients via telepsych during the Safer at Home Order. Clients log into website called *Doxy.me* and see their prescriber through a video chat (similar to Zoom or Facetime--but HIPPA compliant to protect their privacy). Once the Safer at Home Order is lifted, we will slowly transition back to face to face appointments.

We continue to see current patients and are taking new patients at this time. We do prescribe Vivitrol (injection) and oral naltrexone (pill) at our clinic for opioid use disorders. If a client is prescribed Vivitrol we will help set them up at a pharmacy where the injection will be administered. We do not prescribe Suboxone or Methadone and refer out for those services. We are open Monday-Thursday from 08:00 AM-6:00 PM. Clients can call 262-725-4426 to schedule an appointment. Our website is [www.fpckenosha.com](http://www.fpckenosha.com)

## Professional Services Group

The Comprehensive Alcohol and Drug Treatment Program is actively working with a full caseload of participants during the Safer at Home order. **Referrals for new participants are still being accepted during this time.** Possible participants can contact program supervisor Ryan Deglow by phone or email. (262-945-0995 or [rdeglow@psgicp.com](mailto:rdeglow@psgicp.com)) Professional referrals can also contact Ryan during this time for possible referrals. Intakes are coordinated with the assigned recovery specialist as soon as the program can start working with new referrals. The initial intake may require some brief face-to-face contact to obtain necessary signatures for program intake paperwork. At this time, all therapy and group sessions are being done via telehealth. No in-person sessions are being currently offered, as all staff are working from home.

Vivitrol is still the main medication-assisted treatment option CADTP is offering. The initial bloodwork and the Vivitrol injection are being done in coordination with the Kenosha County Division of Health. If Vivitrol is not a viable option, Suboxone can be explored with one of the licensed prescribers through the PSG clinic for participants with opiate use. At this time, the Kenosha County Division of Health is requiring participants to wear a mask during their visits to their clinic.

CADTP is offering services during typical business hours of 8-5pm Monday through Friday, but recovery specialists and therapists are attempting to be as flexible as possible based on participant availability. Groups are also offered during the evening hours for program participants. The Division of Health has more limited availability for scheduling during the Safer at Home order that the assigned recovery specialist will help coordinate.

## Rogers Behavioral Health

Rogers has launched a telehealth treatment platform called Rogers Connect Care, allowing patients to have access to levels of care. Rogers uses Naloxone (Suboxone) and Vivitrol on a case by case basis.

The Living Independently through Financial Empowerment (LIFE) program provides temporary assistance to families whose safety is at risk due to domestic violence. LIFE helps families be financially empowered to live independent, violence-free lives by providing up to three months of cash payments to participant (\$1,500 in month one and \$1,000 in months two and three).

Applicants for the LIFE program must meet the following criteria:

- Experiencing a domestic violence situation in the form of verbal, emotional, physical, or sexual violence, stalking, and/or controlling behaviors and have left or intend to leave the situation;
- A custodial or non-custodial parent to one or more children under the age of 18 -OR- currently pregnant;
- 18 years of age or older;
- A U.S. citizen or qualified non-citizen;
- A resident of Wisconsin; and
  - Currently receiving or has received another public benefit at some point in the prior 12 calendar months - OR- have income at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL)
  - Public benefits include: FoodShare Wisconsin, Wisconsin Works (W-2), Wisconsin Shares Childcare Subsidy Program, Wisconsin Home Energy Assistance Program (WHEAP), BadgerCare Plus or Medicaid, Emergency Assistance (EA), Women, Infant and Children (WIC) Program, Public Housing Subsidy or Housing Choice Voucher (Section 8), Job Access Loan (JAL), Transitional Jobs (TJ) or Transform Milwaukee Jobs (TMJ), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Free and Reduced Lunch, Head Start
